Our Spring Concert in March '24 of an evening of 'Magnificats'

Welcome to this first newletter of the new season of music from the Aylesbury Choral Society. We had a highly successful 2023-24, including two orchestral concerts and one which was largly a cappella. Our year started with a performance of Bach's ever-popular Christmas Oratorio, or at least the first four cantatas of the six that make up this extensive work. We feel - and this is echoed by the audiences and the newspaper reviews - that, with each concert we stage, we are getting increasingly inspirational (one of the words used to describe ACS's singing) in our singing, demonstrating increasing precision and expression. The performance of the Bach was no exception and everyone present (over two hundred in the audience) were enthusiastic and excited. Then, at the end of March, we performed - again, with orchestra - a concert with a theme, something ACS has not done in some time. On this occasion, the theme was 'Magnificat' and included performances of six highly contrasting choral Magnificats (plus two Nunc Dimittises) by Bach, Vivaldi, Purcell, Walmisley, Pärt and Dupré. The Purcell and Walmisley church canticles were specially orchestrated for the evening and this brought a new 'colour' and excitement to the works; and the Arvo Pärt Magnificat, an unaccompanied work, provided an extraordinary and beautiful modern contrast to the majority baroque works. Finally, in the summer, as the previous year, we performed a concert of two distinct halves in which the first half consisted of a cappella performances of Palestrina's Missa Brevis (it is a long time since ACS performed one of the great Renaissance masses and the sound was beautiful - an extract can be found on our website) and three of Anton Bruckner's motets. Then, the second half consisted of a series of lighter works such as Sir Arthur Sullivan's The long day closes, and songs from the jazz and folk repertoires such as Shenandoah and Moon River.
